The curriculum is designed to fulfill the philosophy and goals of the College of Nursing. In thirty months of progressive, sequential work, students are taught to use the nursing process by correlating theory with clinical experience.

Course Prerequisites

Nursing and selected non-nursing courses have prerequisites that must be successfully completed prior to enrollment in these courses. Nursing courses must be taken according to the time frame designated in the curriculum plan. J. Sargeant Reynolds Community College (JSRCC) courses may be taken before the scheduled semester but may not be taken later unless the student is repeating a course.
