THE JEANNE CLERY DISCLOSURE OF CAMPUS SECURITY POLICY & CAMPUS CRIME STATISTICS ACT



The Dean of Administration at Bon Secours Memorial College of Nursing (BSMCON) prepares the Annual Security Report ("ASR") in accordance with the Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act and the Higher Education Opportunity Act.

WHAT IS THE CLERY ACT?

The Clery act is a federal statute that requires colleges and universities participating in federal financial aid programs to maintain and disclose campus crime statistics and security information.

WHO IS A BSMCON CAMPUS SECURITY AUTHORITY ("CSA")?

- CSAs are BSMCONs' first line of defense on campus; they are required to report crimes.
- CSAs' primary responsibility is to report allegations of Clery Act crime to the BSMCON's Safety Administrator who is the Dean of Administration.
- All BSMCON's faculty/staff are CSAs.

WHAT IS BSMCON'S GEOGRAPHY?

The Clery Act requires institutions to disclose statistics for crimes that occur (1) on campus, (2) on public property within or immediately adjacent to the campus, and (3) in or on non-campus buildings or property that BSMCON owns or controls.

- BSMCON's main campus is located at 8550 Magellan Parkway, Suite 1100, Richmond, VA 23227.
- As defined by the Clery Act, the property located at 8570 Magellan Parkway, Suite 100, Richmond, VA 23227, which is used as additional classroom and skills lab space for BSMCON students, is part of the BSMCON campus geography.
- All sidewalks and streets adjacent to the above BSMCON campus location make up BSMCON's public property geography. This includes the overflow parking lot located South of the 8555 Magellan Parkway building.

WHAT ARE THE CLERY CRIMES?

- Clery Act reporting does not require initiating an investigation or disclosing identifying information about the victim
- BSMCON is required to report the following criminal offenses: Murder/Non-negligent Manslaughter;
 Manslaughter by Negligence; Rape; Fondling; Incest;
 Statutory Rape; Robbery; Aggravated Assault;
 Burglary; Motor Vehicle Theft; and Arson.
- BSMCON also must report Hate Crimes involving the previously mentioned crimes or Larceny-Theft, Simple Assault, Intimidation, or destruction/Damage/Vandalism of Property. Additionally, each Hate Crime needs to indicate which category of bias is applicable: race, religion, sexual orientation, gender, gender identity, ethnicity, national origin or disability.
