

3)There is competition for all jobs so students may need to apply for more than one vacancy. Please contact Career Services for assistance.



Which Jobs Am I Qualified For?

Possible jobs include:

Care Companion Monitor Tech Unit Secretary Transporter Patient Service Representative

For nursing students:

After completing NUR 2102 & 2103 (Bon Secours) or your first semester (Southside) or if you are a licensed C.N.A.

Student Nurse ER Tech

If you are a licensed LPN, you may find LPN positions posted as well.

For imaging students:

After completing 2 semesters of your program, you may qualify for a Student Rad Tech or Student Ultrasound Tech job.

Which Schedule or Shift Should I Select?

The recommended shift for a student is PRN: which requires a minimum of 36 hours every 6 weeks (averaging 6 hours each week.) Most managers will allow you to work more hours when they have a need. Many units allow you to self-schedule your hours. Some units have a requirement of 1 weekend per month. Ask about these scheduling requirements in your job interview.

PRN = 36 hours every 6 weeks at a minimum. Ask about weekend requirements. Part-Time = up to 31 hours each week. This is too intense for most students and may not be flexible. Full-Time = 32-40 hours weekly. This is not recommended for students.

Applying

- > Click on a specific job. Complete the entire application.
- Attach your resume saved as a PDF document
- If you get an immediate email indicating you will not be going forward in the hiring process, it is probably due to high applicant volumes. Don't be discouraged....just continue to apply.
- If 10 business days pass without being contacted by anyone in Talent Acquisition (the recruiters), contact Career Services:

Orientation

- If hired, you will be required to attend New Employee Orientation, unit orientation, an occupational health screening, criminal background check, and certain types of training. These are required and must be completed within certain time frames. They differ from those required by your clinical program.
- > Orientation and workplace training must not interfere with your classes/clinicals.
- Check your class schedule and if there is a conflict, ask if on-line orientation is an option. Or try to align this training during a break from classes if your program offers a winter or summer break.
